- Development of a multi-lingual version to expand accessibility beyond English-speaking communities.
- Creation of a browser-based version to enable wider reach and easier access for volunteers.
- Making the ServeNow App open source on GitHub to encourage adoption and customization by other cities and organizations.

"We're proud to help Serve the City improve their logistics and digital tools to mobilize more volunteers," said Andy Fuchs of Toyota Mobility Foundation Europe. "This partnership is about enabling people to live better lives wherever they are."
